

With the aim of restoration in the wake of the damage caused by the Great East Japan Earthquake, the Ken-Iku Kai Group's Ishinomaki Hospital has been moving forward with recovery work at a very fast pace. Now, six months after the devastating disaster struck, I am pleased to report to you that the hospital functions have been completely restored.

As a result of the tsunami, Ishinomaki Hospital suffered catastrophic damage, with its first floor being completely destroyed. To continue functioning as a hospital amidst such circumstances, the hospital moved its medical treatment functions, which had originally been on the first floor, to the second floor, where it continued treating outpatients. On the other hand, as the second floor had to be converted to facilities for providing medical treatment, there was no other alternative but to reduce the hospital's capacity for inpatients, which was 135 patients prior to the disaster, to 80 patients.

The complete restoration of the functions on the first floor has made it possible for the hospital to accommodate the same number of inpatients as it did prior to the disaster. The number of inpatients has also been increasing, with approximately 100 patients currently being hospitalized. The capabilities of the hospital have been enhanced with the installation of new medical equipment to replace the equipment that was immersed in the water from the tsunami and no longer functional. Two doctors of great generosity and goodwill have also been welcomed to the hospital after the disaster, and the recruitment helped it to improve its healthcare preparedness. Furthermore, the construction of a new facility, the Senior Care Home Shion, which had been postponed for a time due to the damage caused by the tsunami, is scheduled to resume this month with the aim of opening its doors next spring.

I would like to express my heartfelt gratitude for the response we received from so many parties, including the members of Maeda Corporation, who promptly started recovery work under harsh conditions immediately following the disaster, as well as to the government authorities for their warm support. We owe our smooth recovery to these parties. Furthermore, Professor Sadayoshi Ito of the Tohoku University Graduate School of Medicine visited the hospital shortly after the disaster, in spite of the poor transportation conditions. His warm words of encouragement greatly heartened the hospital staff members. I would once again like to thank him for his thoughtfulness.
